RE: APPLICATION FOR HERITAGE AND RECREATIONAL TRACKS FUNDING WAIHAO DOWNS HOMESTEAD

I am writing to seek a heritage grant to assist with the cost of reinstating the original carriageway into the grounds of the Waihao Downs homestead. If a heritage grant is not available, then I seek a general grant from the Council.

As the Committee would likely be aware, the property in question is one of the earliest holdings in the Waimate District and also one of the earliest sheep runs in South Canterbury. The homestead itself has a 'B' heritage classification, while the stone stables have a 'C' rating. In its heyday the property was of quite grand proportions and was the centre of industry and social life in the Waihao Downs area. However, over the decades the property was allowed to become quite rundown and has been the subject of various renovations and attempts at modernization.

As the current owners of the property, Mr William Glen and I have been at pains to restore, as best we have been able, as much of the history of the house and surrounds as possible. This has included, inter alia, uncovering and reinstating the cellar and remediating the ballroom, as well as replacing ceilings, ceiling roses, floors, walls, fireplaces, the veranda, the hallway arch and so on. It has been a mammoth and very expensive, but most satisfying, venture.

Now that the house is all but finished, it is our intention to reinstate the original carriageway into the property. At the time we purchased the property, I remarked to Mr Glen that the current driveway into the place seemed to be wrong and it was as if the property had its underpants on backwards. I was confident there was another road into the property and sure enough, after some detective work, we found it. However, it had been allowed to fall into total disrepair and neglect, and had been all but obliterated from the landscape.

Since purchasing the property in 2011 we have successively cleared the land to uncover the full extent of the carriageway, which measures some 340 metres in length. In the process of doing so, we have had to remove old fences, gates, trees,

random wire tangles, branches, piles of rubbish, stacks of bricks, lots of broken glass, undergrowth etc. We also had an arborist carefully prune and shape the remnant of the original buxus hedge near the entrance, which had become very large and ungainly.

The carriageway commences approximately 100 metres from the corner of Serpentine Valley Road and SH 82, and winds through the grounds, past the front of the house, through a heavily wooded section and emerges near the stone stables. It then connects up with the more modern driveway, with egress onto Serpentine Valley Road some 200 metres from the aforementioned corner. The enclosed Google Earth download, **Attachment 'A'**, shows the location of the carriageway relative to SH 82 and Serpentine Valley Road and the enclosed photographs show the current ground view of the carriageway: **Attachment 'B'**.

It is proposed that once reinstated, the carriageway will be a speed limited oneway road, starting at the original entrance to the property and exiting at the existing entrance to the property.

When the new stock fences were installed, we had the old wooden gates returned to their original position at the start of the carriageway and had a local woodsman craft some 'new' wooden posts to match the original ones. I have retained all of the old totara posts with the tapered tops and plan to use them as road markers along the reinstated carriageway. The original picket fence, situated further inside the property, was also repaired and reinstated. Unfortunately the gates belonging to this portion of the carriage way had been hidden under piles of branches and rubbish and had rotted to the point of being completely unusable.

Although cleared of all obstructions and debris, the surface of the carriageway has become fully grassed over, although it is possible, in places, to see the old gravel surface underneath: **Attachment 'C'**. It is proposed to have the existing surface re-graded, compacted and regravelled and to that end we have obtained a quote from Andy Burroughs to undertake the work: **Attachment 'D'**.

We have selected him to do this work because he has come highly recommended; he is sympathetic to the feel of the property and the nature of the work; and because his machinery (a 1.8 tonne digger and a small truck) won't crush the lateral roots of the various old trees that line the carriageway. I appreciate that the grants criteria requests two quotes if possible, but since it is not our intention to have anyone else do the work it seems pointless to seek a quote from somebody else.

Once the regrading and regravelling work has been completed, I will be able to finish the landscaping at the front of the house and either side of the 'new' carriageway. With this in mind, I have propagated the plants that will be needed to re-create the original English look of the garden, although the plantings will also include NZ natives to support our local birdlife. In due course, once all of

the landscaping has been completed, we would expect the property to be enjoyed by various gardening clubs and perhaps groups such as the vintage motor car club.

In support of my application for a grant, please find enclosed photographs of portions of the carriageway when it was still in reasonably good order: **Attachment 'E'**. My speculation is that they pre-date 1994, at a time when the property was still owned by the Henshaws. (Incidentally, according to Barry Henshaw, the carriageway in its entirety has not been used since 1945 or thereabouts when his grandfather purchased the property.)

In conclusion, Mr Glen and I are of the firm view that to reinstate the original carriageway is the final act of kindness to this grand old lady and the Council's assistance in achieving this outcome would be particularly appreciated.
