Roading Asset Management Plan

Footpaths: Council agreed the focus should be on maintaining current assets, while seeking public appetite for future possible unsubsidised spending for new footpaths/footpath renewals.

The meeting was adjourned at 12.46pm for lunch.

Parks & Reserves Asset Management Plan

Again Council agreed the focus should be on maintaining and building on current facilities.

Council discussed the need to capture and record locations and data of cemeteries, monuments and any other historical artefacts located in halls or around the district in public or private ownership.

Three Waters Asset Management Plans (Stormwater, Wastewater, Water)

The Asset Group Manager indicated the size of the AMPs will be reduced at the next review, to make them more manageable.

Council noted the climate change commentary in the AMPs is very generic and high level, however more locally specific outcomes are to be included once the climate change strategic meetings are completed.

Council noted the AMPs are all living documents and will be updated and amended as required.

16.4 DOG AND AGILITY PARK FUNDING REQUEST RECONSIDERATION

Council were presented with a letter of acceptance from Southern Canterbury Agricultural & Pastoral Association Inc (SCAAPA Inc) and information relevant to the agreement; in order to reconsider a resolution from the 24 June 2024 Council Meeting.
