1.1 LOCAL WATER DONE WELL 2025 CONSULTATION HEARINGS

PURPOSE

1. To inform Council of the result of public engagement and consultation conducted on the Local Water Done Well Consultation 2025 and for Council to hear from individuals or organisations who have requested to speak to their submissions.

BACKGROUND

- 2. The formal consultation on the Local Water Done Well was carried out from 15 May 2025 to 16 June 2025.
- 3. The coalition government repealed legislation that had been established under the previous government and replaced it with new legislation enacting their Local Water Done Well Policy. Although left to individual councils to decide overall arrangements for service delivery, the new approach is that water services must operate more like an independent utility business and will be subject to strict economic, environmental and water quality regulation.
- 4. The Local Government (Water Services Preliminary Arrangements) Act 2024 requires all councils to submit a Water Service Delivery Plan (WSDP) by 3 September 2025.
- 5. Council engaged MartinJenkins Consultants to prepare a series of reports to measure each model against the requirements of the Local Water Done Well legislation, namely, sufficiency of investment, funding and financing, affordability, and levels of service delivery.
- 6. On 29 April 2025, Council agreed to consult on two options, being:

Option 1: An internal water services unit (Council's preferred option) Keeping water services in-house and overseen by our Council, and

Option 2: Three-council water services organisation

Joining a new water services organisation with Mackenzie District Council and Timaru District Council.

- 7. The consultation was undertaken in compliance with the alternative requirements for consultation outlined in the Water Services Preliminary Arrangements Act. Sections 60-64 of the Act provided specific conditions and exemptions from corresponding requirements under the Local Government Act 2002.
- 8. The Consultation Document was made available on the Council website at waimatedc.govt.nz/yourwater.
- 9. Promotion of the Consultation Document included advertising in print media in such papers as the Waimate Trader, the Kurow Bugle, and 'Newsline' in the Timaru Courier. Social media included regular postings on Council's facebook page.
- 10. Community Chat sessions were scheduled for various locations around the district and were hosted by Councillors and Council staff. The drop-in events provided a forum for members of the public to speak to Councillors and staff and ask any questions raised by the Consultation Document.

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LOCAL WATER DONE WELL 2025 SUBMISSIONS

- 11. Submissions on the Local Water Done Well 2025 closed on 16 June 2025 at 12pm, with 246 submissions received.
- 12. 17 responses indicated that they wish to speak to Council regarding the content of their submission. Three respondents have since indicated they no longer wish to speak.
- 13. Council will convene on Tuesday 1 July 2025 to make their decisions regarding the Water Done Well 2025 Consultation.

The water problem is too big for Waimate alone, even with ECAN in tow. Despite other regions being thirsty, we need to be aligned with them. Waimate has an extremely poor record for both lotic and lentic water protection. For example, the Waihou River has been toxic for many months now, to the point where I can't even put my kayak in that water. This situation suggests that Waimate District, however it is configured politically across WDC and ECAN, is an ineffective arbiter of water resources and will fail if left to its own devices. Rural water supplies are less important because rural people can get access to streams, rivers, lakes and rain. Most town residents cannot access any of these sources. I have lived rurally since 1995 and have only recently moved into a town (this one), and I am not happy with how dependent I am on others for water.

I know about water problems from having lived through a year-long drought in the Wairarapa - as a rural drystock farmer. I know about water from 4 bad summers in a row in Whangarei, when the creek beside our house dried up to the point where eels were dying on the banks. I know about water shortages from growing up on a farm where the well ran dry every summer. We didn't flush until someone filled the pan. I supervised 7 staff for 10 days at a time on a 34sqkm island with no natural water, and the only way to get there via helicopter, which means we couldn't carry much water there. Now, I turn the tap off when soaping my hands. I use a little water in the bottom of a glass to brush my teeth. I pour that on pot plants. Steamed vege water goes on plants. I don't water my stupid lawn - it can die. Why should I be penalised for others' profligate use of water? You need to educate people rather than charging for water on top of your exorbitant rates. I'd do that job for you because I have lived the experiences of having no water. But I won't pay your stupid fees for water. I'll put a tank in - somewhere - on my stupidly small 600sqm section. YOUR RATEPAYER BASE IS POOR If you think the bulk of Waimate's residents, most of whom are worse off than I am, can pay what I think you're asking, you need to sit down and take deep breath and think again. Because you are going to have a revolt on your hands. You have forgotten that most people here are pensioners, WINZ or ACC supported, solo parents, single females, etc. I suggest you charge the rich farmers a lot more than you plan charging them. They overuse water, they have money in the bank, and the farming practices I see here compared to North are shocking. You need to target your water charges to hit the pockets of the water wasters, e.g., charge for irrigation, which is being mismanaged across this district. In Whangārei in 2023, I paid just over \$2,000 pa for a huge home on a 2.2 acre section and better services. There wasn't a much bigger rate-paying base there due to all the Maori land and rates relief for people below the poverty line in that district. FINDING THE RIGHT EXPERTISE MEANS THINKING OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT Like I have said, this problem is way bigger than Waimate. You are going to have to bargain hard but trust enough to learn. Your best investment would be to find an Arab or Israeli water specialist and get them to tell you how it's done. That's what the wine industry in New Zealand did. We went from drippers hung on a wire 600 mm off the ground to diaphragmed drippers on the ground that provided an even band of moisture rather than the "onion effect" and saved us 39% lost water per 500mm each droplet travelled in the air at 24 degrees C in 64% humidity. That change saved the entire Wairarapa district. That happened on the backs of expertise from the Middle East, where they have lived with water problems for hundreds of years. SOCIAL CONTRACT ALLOWS YOU TO OPERATE If you make us pay for water on top of your crazy rates, which have just been hiked yet again, think again! You are breaching social contract, big time. As I have said, I pay already exorbitant rates here, including to ECAN, only to be told I can't put my kayak in the Waihou River because it's poison. That's because effluent discharges are set too high across this district by ECAN. Farmers are mostly just following ECAN orders, with the exception of a few rogues. That means to me that local government, both district and regional, have broken their social contracts with the people of Waimate - because if I can't safely put my kayak in the water, why should I have to pay for water? The Council, just like Central Government, can wear out its usefulness, even in a country as politically passive as this one. The words "public servant" still mean something to me, because I used to be one. I only had my jobs because people wanted me there doing those jobs, at the end of the day. You are dangerously close to not serving your community by presenting 2 options and no other option based on half-baked ideas about extracting more money from a population you have recently levied with rates increases that are unsustainable. SCALE BACK THE NICE-T0-HAVES AND PAY FOR UPGRADES BY FAIRER MEANS Instead of charging for water, why don't you stop spending money on frivolous things, and things that are nice-tohaves? Water is essential for life. A lot of the other other stuff you do is nice but not necessary. For example, give up on some of your half-baked services like the swimming pool. Fill it in. It's a big water waster, for a start. It's heated but not open in winter, so it's no good to us. I was there at 7 in the morning many days when it was open, and saw no one using it, so it's under-utilised. Yet it's a killer financially. CLOSE YOUR EARS TO THE SPOILED ONLY-CHILD LOBBYISTS Also, why do you need to suck up to special interest groups and waste our rate-payer money? For example, moving the public toilets 20 m down the road just so no one shits near a statue? Are you kidding? After the NZ Central Gov't. treated its veterans according to the US model, which is to say, like they were useless after coming back from all the fighting? And why not cut down on the over-manicuring of your parks? For example, mowing nothing but acorns in the parks while the grass isn't growing in winter and thereby creating a great deal of noise pollution isn't a great look, not to mention all the fuel used and the wear and tear on machinery. THINK OUTSIDE THE BOX I can think of a few other options that might be cheaper than your options 1 or 2. For example, shall we all collect rainwater from our roofs using 1 x 20 or 30 thousand litre tank per household supplied by council rather than sign up to either option? I'd say you could just about get a bulk order of tanks, pumps and all the fittings cheaper than either of your 2 options, for everyone in town. The rural people already have tanks.

Let them figure out the rest. IF YOU MUST CHARGE, BE FAIR


I take the opportunity to comment and feedback on the proposal to keep water services for the district in house, or join with neighbouring councils to deliver services. My comments relate to drinking water supplies only. Firstly I agree with the 3 principles on delivery that are highlighted in the consultation document. I am unsure, because of a lack of clarification, of the extra reporting, management, and planning requirements of either option. Especially for option 1, and the unknown costs of this/ these overheads. In comparing the 2 options and looking at ability to borrow for infrastructure needs, I note that Waimate District council has traditionally not been heavily indebted so not constrained by borrowing limits. So I do not see the funding issue as an impediment to option 1.1 consider that water costs for our rural schemes are expensive now! However we also need to look at the wider community and the retention of trained and capable employees as part of that community, along with the interest of retaining a viable district council in Waimate. Option 1 is more likely to achieve this. I wonder with regard the rural water schemes in the district, how there are savings and efficiencies of having more scale and a larger entity potentially being a more cost effective option. I also think that proposed layers of management, control and reporting in both options, but especially in option 2 only add more cost to water, and little value. I would hope that you as councillors would challenge the burden of overheads that I believe are too high already. The consultation document and the LTP differ on the cost of water over the next 9 year period, with option 1 suggesting a 15% increase, and the LTP at 70% for the Waihaorunga water scheme, so my reliance on your modelling is low in terms of cost increases. And the vagueness of how either model will operate in reality leaves some large parameters as to where costs might actually settle. This is also very concerning, and leaves me looking at the choice of options as a choice of concept, rather than a financial decision. I recognize that in a rural water scheme paying a relatively high price for water, that any future smoothing or amalgamation would likely be to the benefit of those scheme participants if there was a sharing or standardizing of costs, and perhaps that could be beneficial to rural users In summary I am concerned about requirements of governance and reporting and what they will cost. I worry about the loss of good people from our community I like the shorter reporting lines and local nature of option 1 Rural schemes with higher than average cost would benefit from smoothing If we want to have truly local local government then it has to be option 1 James Gibson





I thank WDC for providing the extensive documentation to base my choice on. I don't believe that in NZ we can rely on "economy of scale". Too often we have had a similar tale spun, only to discover after the fact that the predicted benefits didn't appear. In a three-council organisation Waimate District will pull less weight than the so much larger town of Timaru with its larger population and their needs. This means dependency on goodwill of those with other invested interests. Keeping this important issue in our own hands with Government setting the standards will at least provide us with some control. The matter of borrowing capacity should not weigh too heavily since living on debt is one of the least preferred aspects of life in general and for fundamental necessities as well. Debt has this terrible characteristic of coming to haunt us when we can least afford it. Possible difficulty with finding experienced staff is a real issue but this field is not the only field dealing with that problem. Many a time someone will start a career and then, to progress, go look for greener pastures. That is life. Having proper transferable procedures in place and allowing for from time to time needing expert consultations from outside of Council, or for that matter create a cooperative structure with other water management entities to address and access expertise, will tackle this.


At the moment we pay a standard fee for water through our rates, no matter how much water we actually use. Someone told me that they had their sprinklers going all night to keep their lawn green during a period of dry weather. I was appalled - drinking water is an expensive commodity and should not be wasted on luxury lawns, in my not so humble opinion. When I said so, I was told off - according to this person we are entitled to as much water as we deem necessary. I originate in The Netherlands where the use of reticulated water is metered and one pays according to use. This leads to more frugal use of water, with parents keeping taps on their children about the length of showers, efficient use of washing machines and other water hungry appliances. The best way to frugal water use is through peoples wallets! In Waimate we have water meters in town. Council must thus be able to read the use of water per household. My suggestion would be to provide home owners with information about their current water use and in due course start charging households for their actual use, subsequently lowering rates. This should help to limit drinking water use and stimulate rain water catching for use in gardens, clean cars and whatever not necessarily potable use. The water money will have to be ring fenced in the new system so the collected water charges can be allocated there too.

Economy of scale for funding, specialized staff and equipment. During my time as District Engineer for Waimate, one of my engineering staff largely involved with our water schemes, asked for the purchase of an expensive piece of equipment. I was very reluctant but eventually agreed. The item was an ultrasonic flow meter which could provide a non-invasive measure of water velocity inside pipes. At the time, the staff member was constructing a computer model of the Hook-Waituna scheme, and the equipment was described as extremely useful for validating the model, and of benefit in the maintenance and construction of all other schemes. Unfortunately, because of complexity of use, it did not prove nearly as useful as anticipated. In a larger organization where a staff member could be allocated to full time use of such specialized equipment, economy of scale would make ownership more justifiable.

Option 2 is the best long-term solution for all our communities in the Waimate district. As mentioned in your consultation document, Option 2's key advantages creates and allows for Specialist oversight, Greater capacity, Delivering investment plans, Long-term savings, Efficient borrowing. Especially delivering investment plans, as the basis of this current consultation and local water done well is only based on 10 years, not 30 years. This does not give the true picture of future investments that will be required. Also, the plans and related budgets that have been done now are only best assumption at the time of what is known. With rising infrastructure costs, compliance and advancements in technology in the water industry, costs will increase. Option 2 with economy of scale will be able to cope with those changes. Economy of scale will be important as we move into the future, as populations grow and expectations change around water. What we think we are concerned about now, i.e. what appear to be key advantages in option 1, could likely seem not so important, and sometimes inhibiting in the future. Option 1 advantages also lacks that economy of scale and feels short term and inward looking. Note, it also is important to remember that local knowledge won't be lost. That will be an individual employee's choice whether they stay or leave because of changes, and that cannot be controlled in any workplace. There are also advantages of staff resourcing under Option 2. Smaller organization struggle to attract the required skilled staff and level of staffing needed. Under a larger water services provider (a Council Controlled Organization [CCO]), this is more achievable by economy of scale, and the opportunities that it provides. One area that has not been a focus is "intergenerational". Our water supplies need to be intergenerational. It is not about just us now. A lot of these water supplies/schemes, and wastewater networks were lead or put in by people in the past who had a vision for the future and their communities. Whether it was for public health, business, industry or farming. We may not be the founders of these water supplies/schemes, and wastewater networks, but we are stewards, which still requires leadership and vison for the future and future generations who will need these water supplies/schemes, and wastewater networks (good asset management and future planning). I believe that option 2 allows for this in a more focused way, as a water services provider (CCO).







ABOUT FEDERATED FARMERS

Federated Farmers of New Zealand is a membership organisation, which is mandated by its members to advocate on their behalf and ensure representation of their views. Federated Farmers does not collect a compulsory levy under the commodities levy act and is funded from voluntary membership.

Federated Farmers represents rural and farming businesses throughout New Zealand. We have a long and proud history of representing the needs and interests of New Zealand's farmers.

Federated Farmers aims to empower farmers to excel in farming. Our key strategic outcomes include provision for an economic and social environment within which:

- · Our members may operate their business in a fair and flexible commercial environment;
- Our members' families and their staff have access to services essential to the needs of a vibrant rural community; and
- Our members adopt responsible management and sustainable food production practices.

1. SUBMISSION

- 1.1 Federated Farmers welcomes the opportunity to submit on the proposed Local Water Done Well (LWDW) for Waimate District Council. Federated Farmers appreciates the Council initiative to support communities to have their say.
- 1.2 The Council has identified two options:
 - a) A jointly owned Council Controlled Organisation (CCO) with Mackenzie, Timaru, and Waimate district councils; or
 - b) An Internal Water Services Unit.
- 1.3 Federated Farmers supports Waimate District Council in its preferred approach of an Internal Water Services Unit. Federated Farmers have submitted on the other Councils consultations on the Local Water Done Well proposal, and recommended that they opt for the internal model, so we appreciate and support Council opting for the Internal Water Services Unit.
- 1.4 Federated Farmers focus of concern for the CCO option for the Waimate district included the lack of local oversight and control with an independent entity. Our submission highlights specific concerns or questions at a district level and comments on information we have determined from other council Local Water Done Well consultations that may provide other questions in context with this consultation.
- 1.5 Generally speaking, nationwide rural communities depend on quality drinking water and many organise their supply themselves the Waimate district being no exception. New Zealand's rural landscape is characterised by many varied drinking water schemes, with ground, surface, and roof water configurations. These schemes may be specific to individual farms or be small networks of households and buildings in a locality, and are run by farmers, other volunteers, trusts, or committees.
- 1.6 The importance of rural water networks cannot be understated. Farmers have invested significant time, resources and labor into rural water schemes. They often supply neighboring properties in good faith. The economic success of these districts relies on how water infrastructure, particularly stock-water and irrigation is managed.

3

Governance and Representation

- 1.7 The joint council CCO model aims to capture efficiencies from being part of a larger organisation with the aim of enabling more investment and/or lower prices, while effectively managing risks. Federated Farmers note the key disadvantages of the joint CCO is less local control, in that Waimate District Council would share decision making and control with other councils. Other disadvantages include the financial impact, in that the transfer of assets and debt to a CCO could negatively impact Councils viability and also concerns regarding the governance structure of the proposed entity, again highlighting meaningful governance and accountability to ensure that local interests are adequately represented.
- 1.8 Federated Farmers support Council in recognition that accountability of a new CCO will be complicated and influencing its direction for local ratepayers will only become more complex. A standard process for councils of annual plans and long term plans with presentation of financials provides the community with robust and transparent processes and importantly the opportunity to provide feedback and have input into future direction and decision making. Council has highlighted that with the new CCO structure:
 - "The water organisation will be required to provide an annual report to the shareholding councils. The shareholding councils will have the power to require the organisation to provide additional reports such as an asset management plan or quarterly reports, if they wish. The shareholding councils will appoint directors to the board of the water organisation and will be able to remove directors or decide not to renew their appointments.
 - Under the multi-council water services organisation model, councils will need to introduce ways to converse with communities on water needs and concerns, so that can be fed into the statement of expectations"
- 1.9 The power of the community to have oversight and ability to comment or influence change under the CCO model will be far more complex than that under the internal model, and potentially that direct link with community will not be available.
- 1.10 Federated Farmers agrees that a CCO model would offer very limited oversight at a local level and one community share in a large entity will not ensure that local farmers interests are heard. In particular, reducing the local voice in pricing and infrastructure decisions.
- 1.11 We had noted that the other council consultation documents had voiced the concern that under the Water Services Entities Bill, asset "ownership" may be nominal only, therefore potentially reducing local farmer (and Council) influence over investment and decision making.

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- 1.12 Federated Farmers would also add to the list of risks with the CCO model transition challenges in establishing the organization. Coordinating the transition, staff and debt may be complex. We had also noted from other councils' consultation documents that the assumptions based on the cost of establishment of the CCO were substantial. The South Canterbury WSCCO modelling provided as supplementary information by the Council had noted in the assumptions that the combined cost of the CEO, CFO, Board Chair, and directors costs would be close to \$1M per annum for the CCO model.
- 1.13 For the farming community, water services are fundamentally a local issue. The need for a robust governance structure established under any new joint model is critical for Federated Farmers. For our purpose, bigger entities may not necessarily be better. We wonder how volunteer scheme committees will interact with an independent board, with expertise in business, but not the locality. We prefer to take the risk of moving into the future with the governance of local people, working with local problems, to achieve local outcomes.
- 1.14 A further risk for the CCO model for Waimate is operational or governance differences in opinion or positions between Councils. The Councils in the proposed combined model have different priorities and/or potentially unequal resource contributions. The risk for Federated Farmers members is a model where another Councils priorities or debt push local priorities to the back of the queue. We note that Timaru is has a large urban centre and may prioritise urban upgrades and via the proposed "price harmonization" may push costs onto the rural sector.
- 1.15 Successful shared services would require clear, enforceable governance and strong alignment between Councils. Without this, disputes can and will delay projects, increase costs for ratepayers, or reduce service responsiveness. Comparing the consultation documents between the Councils for the CCO model suggests different priorities between the Councils, and Waimate has highlighted the difference between its rural support focus compared with others with more urban/commercial and for Waimate there is less risk associated with an internal business unit.

Equity and Asset Transfer

- 1.16 Government (DIA) modelling suggests that per household water costs could jump from approximately \$1640 (if reformed) to approximately \$8690 (without reform) by 2051¹. Rural communities are concerned that the proposal of a combined CCO will potentially result in a heavier financial burden on rural users, the concern being that rural communities could see costs rise up to 13 fold, driven by compliance and regulatory requirements.
- 1.17 Local Water Done Well impacts smaller, remote rural communities. This is a key concern and reinforces the need for councils to implement careful and responsible financial

planning that takes into account the risks of the new model to rural communities. Rural ratepayers want certainty that they are not carrying the financial burden of other councils or being used to fund urban water schemes and upgrades. For the rural community risk equates to financial cost whether it be via the rates invoice or a separate invoice from a new CCO entity. Too often rural communities find themselves last on the list for proposed upgrades but used as part of the mechanism for paying for other (urban) areas.

- 1.18 Many local water schemes across the country have been established and funded at the rural grass roots level predominantly for stock water and irrigation. Some schemes are debt free and well managed. Clarity and transparency about any new structure would need to be provided to those existing schemes about how they would fit into the new model. It needs to be clear what local oversight will be provided at the governance level, especially where these schemes have established governance structures and separate financials.
- 1.19 Federated Farmers supports the establishment of an internal business unit for water services. We are opposed to the formation of a more remote external structure with uncertainty about its priorities and the overhead cost of its establishment. We contend that this is the best path to ensuring rural communities are fairly represented in a transparent way. This is worth more to our community than elevated access to debt or theoretical efficiencies. An internal business unit should account for the historic financial and personal investment farmers have put into the district's water infrastructure.
- 1.20 It is concerning that water quality standards are becoming exceedingly difficult to meet. Regulations enforced by Taumata Arowai and Regional Councils have become overcomplicated, duplicative and time consuming. The alarming cost of regulatory compliance is unaffordable. Privately owned rural drinking water suppliers have historically provided drinking water to farms and neighboring community members. However, continued restrictions on land use within protected drinking water zones could prevent this function of good-will in future.
- 1.21 Federated Farmers would like to understand more how the new regulations will affect privately owned bores and small rural schemes in the district. Also understanding more about who pays and who "controls", that is, which schemes will be folded into the broader ring fenced water pricing and governance structure. Local farmers need clarity that rural schemes will retain autonomy.

Economic Regulation

1.22 Oversight of the economic performance of water service providers is essential to ensure they are efficient, financially prudent, and charging fair prices. Because water services are monopolies (ie local farmers can't choose another provider), an economic regulator via the Commerce Commission is proposed by Government to step in to protect consumers

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from the risk of excessive charges and poor service. Under the Water services Bill is water economic regulation regime modelled on the system used for electricity lines and gas pipelines.


1.23 What is not clear to Federated Farmers is if a Council decides to opt into the CCO model for water services, whether that CCO model qualifies to meet the criteria of a "large entity" under the economic regulation framework, thereby qualifying for regulation by the Commerce Commission. It is Federated Farmers understanding that not all CCO's will automatically qualify as "large entities" subject to full economic regulation by the Commerce Commission. If the proposed CCO does not meet the criteria, this is another major risk for Council to factor in considering a CCO model.

Time frames

- 1.24 Federated Farmers would also note that the time pressure on communities and councils for this consultation process is very narrow. Council must deliver a Water Service Delivery Plan by 3rd September 2025 less than 3 months away raising further risk of rushed outcomes.
- 1.25 Federated Farmers thanks the Council for considering our submission on Local Water Done Well.

Te Rūnanga o Waihao strongly recommend for Waimate District Council to adopt **Option 2 – Three-Council Water Services Organisation** as the most future-focused, collaborative, and resilient approach to managing water services across the region for the benefit of all.

We request the opportunity to speak to our submission at the Council hearing on Monday, 30 June 2025.

1. Introduction

Te Rūnanga o Waihao, representing the hapū of Kāti Hāteatea, Te Aitaka a Tapuiti, and Kāti Huirapa, welcomes the opportunity to submit on the Waimate District Council's Local Water Done Well (LWDW) consultation — a critical step forward in shaping the future of water services across our takiwā (territory).

Through the Te Rūnanga o Ngãi Tahu Act 1996 (Ngãi Tahu Act), Ngãi Tahu is the statutorily recognised representative tribal body of Ngãi Tahu whānui, comprising over 80,000 registered iwi members. Te Rūnanga o Waihao, one of the eighteen Ngãi Tahu Papatipu Rūnanga across Te Waipounamu (South Island), is recognised by statute and represents over 25,000 registered whānau who whakapapa to Waihao.

Our takiwā centres on Wainono, sharing interests with Te Rūnanga o Arowhenua to Waitaki, and extends inland to Ōāmārama and the Main Divide. Waihao is our tūrangawaewae — our place to stand. *Appendix One - Te Rūnanga o Waihao Takiwā Map.*

The contemporary relationship between the Crown and Ngãi Tahu is defined by three core documents: Te Tiriti o Waitangi (the Treaty), the Ngãi Tahu Deed of Settlement 1997, and the Ngãi Tahu Claims Settlement Act 1998. These confirmed the rangatiratanga (authority) of Ngãi Tahu and our relationship with the natural environment and whenua within the takiwā.

As mana whenua, Te Rūnanga o Waihao has a unique and abiding interest in the sustainable management of te taiao (the environment). Kaitiakitanga — our inherited obligation to protect the health of our natural world — is both a cultural imperative and a statutory right. The health of water systems and their management is inseparable from the health of people.

The importance of this consultation is deeply rooted in the lived experiences of our people. Access to clean and safe drinking water is not a privilege — it is a basic human right and an essential requirement for the wellbeing of our communities.

Our Waihao community, including our Marae, has long faced challenges related to water safety and inadequate infrastructure. Most recently, Taumata Arowai, the Water Services Authority, issued "Do Not Drink" notices

after nitrate levels in our water supply exceeded the maximum acceptable value (MAV). In response, Te Rūnanga o Waihao placed a Rāhui Tapu on drinking water consumption at the Waihao Marae to protect our whānau from the continued health risks associated with elevated nitrate levels.

This is just one example of the urgent actions we've been forced to take to safeguard our community's health. Sadly, this situation is not unique. Similar water quality concerns persist throughout the Waimate District and neighbouring areas, particularly in smaller settlements and rural communities. This is unacceptable. A coordinated, region-wide response is urgently needed.

One of the most pressing challenges today is the need for collective action to restore and protect our water systems in partnership – it is too significant to do alone. We believe the only viable path to equitable and sustainable water outcomes is a shared regional model that draws on the strengths of partnership, collective resourcing, innovative long-term thinking, and integrated governance.

2. Our Preferred Option: Three-Council Water Services Organisation (Option 2)

Te Rūnanga o Waihao strongly supports Option 2 — the creation of a Three-Council Water Services Organisation — as the most sustainable, strategic, and culturally aligned model for the future of water services.

The Waimate, Mackenzie, and Timaru District Councils all sit within our takiwā. We work closely and collaboratively with Te Rūnanga o Arowhenua, Te Rūnanga o Moeraki, Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu, Environment Canterbury, and government agencies — it's a model that works. We see an opportunity for our council partners to join this approach, which is why we strongly encourage a collaborative, all-of-region model that embraces the voice, values, and leadership of mana whenua — for the benefit of all.

This model enables:

- Environmental and cultural stewardship
- Intergenerational equity
- Cross-boundary innovative solutions
- Genuine regional leadership and partnership between mana whenua and local government

We call on Council to:

- Acknowledge that access to clean and safe drinking water is a necessity for the wellbeing of our communities and that change is needed
- Uphold theTreaty and the role of mana whenua in shaping long-term water services and infrastructure projects
- Embed a respected and valued partnership with mana whenua that provides governance and co-design principles of the multi-CCO from inception
- Weave together and embed mātauranga Māori and science across the organisation

Contextual Relevance:

The forthcoming Local Government (Water Services) Bill (expected for Royal Assent mid-2025) will introduce a new planning and accountability framework including economic regulation and consumer protections. A multi-CCO can provide independent, professional oversight and strategic governance that ensures water services across the region are aligned with this evolving regulatory landscape.

3. Concerns with the In-House Model (Option 1 - Internal Water Services Unit)

While we acknowledge Council's consideration of Option 1 — Te Rūnanga o Waihao has serious concerns about the long-term viability and equity of retaining all water services in-house. We recognise some perceived advantages such as local control and familiarity, but these are outweighed by significant structural, financial, and strategic risks.

Disadvantages:

Long-Term Financial Pressures

- High capital requirements for infrastructure upgrades
- Escalating costs due to inflation and regulatory upgrades
- Increased debt and rates; possible service trade-offs

4. Shared Vision, Collaboration & Role of Mana Whenua

A future-focused, collaborative and resilient approach to managing water services across the region requires unified purpose, deep partnership, and strategic innovation. Recognising the role of mana whenua as a genuine Treaty partner begins with a shared vision and working closely to shape the future water services and investment across the region — one that actively includes mana whenua to ensure that the water services reflect cultural values, promote environmental sustainability, and support the needs of our communities, now and for future generations.

Te Rūnanga o Waihao holds a long-term, intergenerational view and has recently developed a Taiao Strategy in partnership with whānau, to protect and restore the taiao – reflecting our role as mana whenua, holding rangatiratanga and as kaitiaki for our takiwā. The strategy is grounded in four Pou: Rangatiratanga, Wai Māori, Mahinga Kai, and Wāhi Tūpuna – providing a cultural and strategic framework that aligns across workstreams and informs interactions with councils, agencies, and organisations. This is an example of the kind of strategic, kaupapa Māori approach we believe would add significant value to the establishment and operation of the multi-CCO.

A regional, multi-party model that centres partnership and shared vision at its core could be an exemplar – laying the foundation for a more just, responsive, and future-ready water system.

5. Recommendations for Implementation

To ensure that Option 2 – the Three-Council Water Services Organisation – delivers long-term environmental, cultural, and operational success, Te Rūnanga o Waihao recommends the following core implementation measures. These are essential to establishing a trusted, effective, and enduring model.

5.1 Establish a Relationship Agreement and Governance Protocol

- Success depends on more than structure it requires clarity, trust, and process. A formal relationship
 agreement will prevent ambiguity and build enduring collaboration akin to what you see in other
 regions.
- Give effect to the Treaty. Uphold the principles of partnership, participation, and protection honouring the Crown's Treaty obligations while building trust and long-term meaningful relationships.
- A jointly developed Relationship Agreement outlining shared principles, roles, and how we will work
 together to safeguard water services across the region. Additionally, it will outline the mana whenua
 director appointment process.
- Annual joint planning and review sessions between councils and mana whenua.
- Early establishment of governance protocols that set expectations around equity, inclusion, and accountability.

5.2 Formal Governance Appointment

- A mana whenua-appointed director role on the new multi-CCO is crucial. This will ensure that the new
 governance structure prioritises directors with the right expertise, skills, knowledge and ability to
 represent relevant perspectives.
- It ensures that the water services and infrastructure projects reflect cultural values, promote environmental sustainability, and support the needs of our communities.

5.3 Co-Design the Water Services Strategy and Strategic Framework

- Mana whenua is committed to providing resources and working collaboratively to co-develop the primary strategic documents guiding the entity.
- It will provide for intergenerational thinking, driving long-term outcomes for our environment and communities.
- The strategy will come to life through its rich tapestry, a shared vision, the delivery of actions, and embedding into the day-to-day business and the way we work together enhancing the wellbeing of our communities, people and place.

5.4 Embed Mātauranga Māori and Science Across Operations

- Ensures that mātauranga Māori and cultural values are embedded from the outset for long-term planning.
- Cultural and environmental monitoring moves beyond engineering metrics and include cultural and ecological health indicators.

5.5 Invest in Workforce Development and Cultural Capability

- A water entity grounded in partnership must reflect that in its workforce.
- Cultural competency and Maori capability must be built into recruitment, training, and operations.
- Enables enduring relationships and regional unity across the new entity and with the communities we serve.

6. Conclusion

We close by quoting from the Crown's apology to Ngāi Tahu in the Deed of Settlement:

"The Crown apologises to Ngāi Tahu for its past failures to acknowledge Ngāi Tahu rangatiratanga and mana over the South Island lands within its boundaries, and, in fulfilment of its Treaty obligations, the

Crown recognises Ngāi Tahu as the tāngata whenua of, and holding rangatiratanga within, the Takiwā of Ngāi Tahu Whānui.... and, with the historical grievances finally settled as to matters set out in the Deed of Settlement signed on 21 November 1997, to begin the process of healing and to enter a new age of cooperation with Ngāi Tahu."

This is an opportunity for Waimate District Council to lead in partnership. Te Rūnanga o Waihao strongly recommend for Waimate District Council to adopt **Option 2 – Three-Council Water Services Organisation** as the most future-focused, collaborative, and resilient approach to managing water services across the region for the benefit of all.



Water Services Submission Russell Wallace

Well here we are again with the Government insisting they know better than local communities, forcing more change and massive expenditure onto local bodies and ultimately onto the ratepayers who fund Council.

Waimate has always done reasonably well delivering potable water to the urban community, with the odd challenge in rural areas. I support the Option 1 keeping water in house.

I want to speak first about the rural schemes, which, by virtue of their widespread network coverage, are the most costly to upgrade to the Governments "gold standard".

Submissions I have made on this very issue in the past I consider, have been lost in the "noise" of bureaucracy, and once again I am here to say the same thing and hopefully I be heard.

Rural water scheme history in the Waimate District was delivered mainly by the farming communities who, in order to survive and grow their family farming business's, needed good stock water. The bonus was that this water was also available for domestic consumption and they no longer had to rely on rainwater or expensive wells. These schemes were constructed on the whole by way of voluntary labour, as a way of paying towards their cost of connecting to the scheme. When the water finally flowed onto these farms their lives changed, no more worry about keeping water up to thirsty animals during a drought and not having to ration domestic water in times of low rainfall or shallow wells.

This has been the status quo in our district for 50 plus years. So now the bureaucrats have deemed these schemes unsafe, and massive expenditure is required. They obviously do not realize that nearly all of the water in these schemes is used to water animals and other general use.

I estimate that less than 1% of this water on these schemes is actually consumed internally by humans. Why are we requiring hugely expensive upgrades at point of supply, when the obvious option is to filter water at point of entry into the house, with a requirement that filters be regularly serviced and kept current!

It also places responsibility onto the user not the Council. This solution in my opinion resolves many problems, mainly the massive increase in rates to fund these expensive blanket unnecessary upgrades.

In regards to the urban water supply I feel we are well served with the way Council is moving forward with ongoing water main replacements, water supply security, and other network upgrades, which have been happening for many years.

I understand that the water supplies for our urban community face a few challenges mainly the presence of "iron" in the water which has to be treated before entering the network. There have been over the years many negative comments made about the Waimate water which are now totally unfounded and without support.

We have installed an inline filter for our kitchen and we have no complaints or concerns about the quality or taste of the water we are supplied with.

Our water team do a great job keeping supplies available for the community and I most definitely support the concept of keeping control of the Waimate water local and maintaining our great team of water staff. Loss of control and local knowledge is, in my view not negotiable.

The only concern I do have with option 1 is the potential to create a new, and of course expensive, bureaucracy within the Waimate District Council to administer and run this "Internal water services unit". This part of any, "restructure" needs to be carefully managed to minimize cost and potential for further massive rate rises in our community.

Waste Water is an area where locally our council can do better. Not as far as the operational system functions, but in the way it charges for new connections to the system.

Our treatment plant and disposal to land system seems to have been well designed, developed and maintained. It appears to work well and we are fortunate that we do not seem to have the problems faced by some other local bodies in dealing with their wastewater.

I believe an unfair system exists where people in different parts of town pay different connection fees. I understand there are 5 different wastewater connection charges in the urban area.

An intriguing thought has made me question that perhaps our Council is double dipping with these sewer connection charges, especially where new sewer laterals have been installed over the past few decades.

Council obviously plans for these extensions in order to open up new areas for development around the town. So these will be included in the annual and long term planning process.

These planning processes and subsequent approval see the cost of the proposed work calculated into rate calculations in order to pay for the developments.

So our community, through its rates, pays for this capital expenditure, development occurs and the rate burden is then wider spread among the community.

Sadly it doesn't end there because as people connect to the new extensions, which ratepayers have paid for, they are stung for a massive capital payment to Council join the sewer, which has already been paid for by the Ratepayers as Council Capital expenditure. I note on page 17 of the document, plans to spend \$1.6 million on urban sewer extensions which will be paid for out of rate income, because all the money the Council has, has at some point come from the ratepayer.

My question is, will people who connect to these extensions be charged an exorbitant connection fee reflective of the capital cost of construction. In other words does Council plan to have all who connect to that extension pay for it again, plus of course, the cost of "debt servicing"?

I have a strong interest in this issue, as I do not consider Council is being even handed or honest in the way it is developing and extending its wastewater network.

Storm water in Waimate is well handled by the network apart from periods of extreme weather, for which there is always going to be challenges. Waimate is fortunate to have topographic fall allowing storm water to flow away from the town and into the Waimate creek. We obviously need to continue to do maintenance, such as the older kerb and channeling replacement being undertaken around town, which assist in getting storm water where it need to go.

There are also many properties in town who deal with their own storm water through the use of soak holes which seem to work fine especially in the area towards the Waimate creek. I am interested to

know what the future holds for these properties that independently deal with their own storm water, and will they be "dragged" into some new wider storm water policy across the wider town.

Overall Waimate District Council and its fore runners have served our community well in the provision of all things water.

The challenges being forced upon us all by Central Government will take wise and careful planning to ensure that our community receives value for money spent, and that there is a robust and well conceived plan for our future development and growth.

Public health advice on Local Water Done Well

- 1. We are providing advice on the Waimate District Council's proposal for Local Water Done Well. Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora has statutory obligations under the Pae Ora (Healthy Futures) Act 2022 and the Health Act 1956 to improve, promote and protect the health of people and communities. This advice has been prepared by the National Public Health Service (NPHS) Te Waipounamu of Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora. NPHS Te Waipounamu provides public health services to the South Canterbury region including the Waimate district.
- 2. NPHS Te Waipounamu does not have a view on the preferred option for the delivery of water services in the Waimate district. We acknowledge that these plans are intended to encourage councils to examine how they can sustainably fund three waters infrastructure long into the future, including meeting regulatory requirements in terms of quantity and quality of water and supporting growth.
- 3. Waimate District Council's proposal for Local Water Done Well may have significant implications for public health.
- 4. The following outlines our technical advice on Waimate District Council's proposal for Local Water Done Well to protect communities from waterborne diseases, through the provision of drinking water supplies, sewerage and stormwater systems.

Specific Advice

- 5. NPHS Te Waipounamu supports Council's proposal to ensure that the maintenance and strengthening of three waters service delivery allows for population growth. We support the continued operation of the three waters infrastructure so that services are not reduced or withdrawn. The provision of safe and adequate supplies of drinking water and the collection, treatment and disposal of sewage and wastewater protects public health.
- 6. Safe drinking water is crucial to public health. The well-known outbreak of gastroenteritis in Havelock North in August 2016, which was caused by contaminated drinking water, resulted in an estimated 5,500 of the town's 14,000 residents becoming ill with campylobacteriosis, and of these, 45 people required hospital treatment. It is possible that

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- the outbreak contributed to three deaths, and an unknown number of residents developed long-term health complications.
- 7. The safe collection, treatment and disposal of sewage and wastewater also protects public health. Human waste carries a wide range of pathogenic micro-organisms, and many are still viable and virulent, even if sewage has been in the environment for some time. Sewage and wastewater may also contain toxic chemicals, particularly from industrial and trade waste sources.
- 8. NPHS Te Waipounamu supports Council's proposal to invest in water services to meet regulatory requirements.
- NPHS Te Waipounamu supports Council ensuring that there is ongoing investment in the renewal and maintenance of infrastructure to maintain levels of service in the medium and long term.
- 10. NPHS Te Waipounamu notes Council's preferred delivery model appears cost-effective and will keep costs manageable for users. NPHS Te Waipounamu supports the need to keep costs manageable, whilst at the same time protecting people's health by ensuring access to safe drinking water, stormwater and wastewater disposal is affordable.
- 11. NPHS Te Waipounamu supports Council's proposal to ensure adequate resources are allocated to higher risk communities, including those that are currently under-serviced or not serviced.
- 12. NPHS Te Waipounamu encourages Council to consider the impacts on intergenerational equity and supports Council's consideration of the impacts of climate change to ensure that this essential public health infrastructure is protected from extreme weather events.
- 13. NPHS Te Waipounamu encourages Council to ensure that there is equitable provision of adequate water supplies to meet health and sanitation requirements.
- 14. NPHS Te Waipounamu encourages Council to recognise the importance of relationships with the regional council. These discussions should include the interaction between the stormwater and flood protection systems so that stormwater ingress to sewers is managed, and will reduce the risk of sewage overflows, but also that flood risk from stormwater ponding is not increased.
- 15. NPHS Te Waipounamu acknowledges Council's exploration of the potential efficiencies that could be achieved through either an internal water services unit or a joint council water services organisation.
- 16. While there is no specific requirement in the Local Government (Water Services Preliminary Arrangements) Act 2024 for iwi Māori to be consulted, NPHS Te Waipounamu encourages Council to work closely with mana whenua to ensure water services reflect cultural values, promote environmental sustainability and support their needs.
